



Antillean Adventist University Student Non-Discrimination Policy

Antillean Adventist University affirms that every human being is valuable in the sight of God. The University expects students, to treat each other and the wider community with respect and dignity, and will not tolerate discrimination. Antillean Adventist University maintains a practice of equal education opportunity for all applicants without regard to race, color, national origin, age, gender, religion, marital status, disability or for any other legally protected factor.

Sexual orientation, which is not a legally protected factor, is regarded by the University in a manner consistent with the position of the Seventh-day-Adventist Church, which makes a distinction between orientation and behavior. Sexual orientation will not be considered in making determination regarding academic, and work-study program, except as necessary to upholding the University's commitment to moral propriety, as understood by the Seventh-day Adventist Church. However, promoting or engaging in certain behaviors is prohibited in the University Code of Student Conduct for being inconsistent with the moral religious and ethical values and principles promoted by the Seventh-day-Adventist Church (*See Student Handbook*).
